

Leader Guide - Session 2

Outline:

I. We can have hope for our future, knowing one-day God will set all things right.

- A. Still, we must admit that things in this world right now are very wrong.
- B. We have to acknowledge that some of us are going through a difficult season this Christmas. This includes recognizing ways you are struggling right now.

II. God allows us to choose the object of our fixation in a world that is not right.

- A. While it's easy to fixate on the crises in life, we can make the conscious choice to fixate on Christ.
- B. In the storms of life, we learn to practice "spiritual replacement"-focusing on Jesus without ignoring the painful reality of this world.
- C. We remember Jesus was also in an advent season of waiting.

Ill. Luke's Gospel tells about a storm that occurred in the disciples' lives.

- A. Jesus tells His disciples to cross to the other side of the lake (see Luke 8:22).
- B. Jesus falls asleep while a storm arises (see Luke 8:23-24).
- C. Jesus rebukes the storm and asks, "Where is your faith?" (Luke 8:25).

IV. Jesus went into a storm with His people so He could show them that He was greater than the storm.

- A. Life is full of storms, but our storms are full of Jesus.
- B. God uses our storms to make a way for us to see His works and His glory.
- C. Our job in the storm is to not lose focus on Jesus and to stay fixated on Him.

V. It's critical for us to remain focused on Jesus during a storm because ...

- A. Staying focused on Jesus fulfills our purpose (see Colossians 1:16).
 - Our heart beats because we were made by Jesus and for Jesus.
 - We have the grace of God and a personal relationship with Christ.
- B. Staying focused on Jesus gives us hope in any and every circumstance.
 - We have hope because we know that Jesus was raised from the dead.
 - We have the promise that Jesus will make all things right.
- C. Staying focused on Jesus enables our worship of Him to be uninterrupted.
 - The disciples worshiped Jesus when they saw His power in the storm.
 - We likewise express true worship to Jesus when we witness His power



Discussion:

- 1. How do you handle the tension between any struggles you may be facing and the cultural expectations to enjoy the Christmas season?
- 2. How does the idea of "spiritual replacement" resonate with you and your circumstances right now? What does it mean to focus on Jesus without denying the challenges you face?
- 3. Does Jesus' response- "Where is your faith?"-to His disciples in the midst of a storm-tossed sea surprise you? Why or why not?
- 4. When you're experiencing the pain and turmoil of life's storms, what gives you perspective? How does your faith in Christ help you weather the storms?
- 5. Which of the reasons/benefits listed for staying focused on Jesus in the midst of life's storms stand out to you? Why?
