Session 7: Reunion

Mile 7- Reunion

“Open our eyes to see the resurrected Son of God.”

Our journey together concludes with the seventh mile. In Luke 24, it wasn't until the disciples had reached their destination and broken bread with Jesus that they recognized Him for who He truly was.

The final video of the Seven-Mile Miracle series will give you the opportunity to open your eyes in the same way that the disciples opened theirs.

“What was it in the breaking of the bread that caused the disciples to see Jesus?”

They saw something in the way Jesus broke the bread that caused them to see who Jesus was. Was it in the movement of His hands, the sound of His voice, or in the simple act of sharing the meal that they recognized Him?

“The Resurrection is not an event. It is a person.”

This journey was not designed for you to recall an event. It was designed for you to get to know the Savior. Jesus was not just resurrected; He is the Resurrection. Just as the disciples' hearts burned within them on their journey to Emmaus, the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ is meant to stir within you a recognition of who He is.

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“He took the bread, blessed it, broke it, and gave it to them.”

Despite walking alongside Jesus for seven miles, His own disciples did not recognize Him until He broke bread with them at the end of the journey. They breaking of the bread is symbolic of the way God uses us- He takes us, blesses us, breaks us, and gives us to the world. Pray that whatever stage you are in; you will be able to see the purpose God has for you.

“They saw the nail-scarred hands of the Son of God.”

As the disciples experienced, the circumstances of life can blind you from seeing God in your life, even if He walks right alongside you. But when Jesus broke bread with His disciples and gave the bread to them, they saw the nail-scarred hands that were reaching out to the. Pray that Jesus will be revealed to you as He gives His life to you.

“The seventh mile- a mile of completion.”

There is significance behind Jesus revealing Himself at the end of the seventh mile. It is seen as a mile of completion and perfection. S as you conclude the journey of the Seven-Mile Miracle, pray that you will be reunited with God in a new way.

Read Luke 24:30-35. For a deeper study read John 11:25-26 and Matthew 14:13-21.

Discussion Questions:

1. How was Jesus reunited with His Father in Luke 23:46?

2. In the video, Pastor Furtick said, “The Resurrection isn’t an event; it’s a person.” How does this change your perception of Jesus’ resurrection?
3. How did Jesus reveal Himself to His disciples in Luke 24:30-35? Why do you believe that He waited until He broke bread with them after the seventh mile to do so?
4. How have you personally recognized Jesus in your life?
5. At what point would you consider yourself “reunited” with Him?
6. In your own words, describe the pattern of God taking, blessing, and breaking His chosen people. How has Jesus take, blessed, and broken your life?

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7. Just as He did with Jesus, God breaks us with a purpose. What purpose do you believe God has for the breaking stages of your life?
8. As we complete the seventh mile together, how has Jesus revealed Himself to you in a fresh way? What is one paradigm shift that you have experienced over the Seven-Mile Miracle journey? This week commit to sharing this shift with someone close to you.
